OUR HISTORY

Mynydd Isa Football Club have represented the local community of the village since establishing in 1984. In recent years, the club has grown tremendously to become one of the largest in North Wales with over 500 participants from juniors to seniors.

The club's senior sides dissolved in 2009 leaving the village without a senior section. In 2016, James Hollyoak re-established the senior section as his Ewloe Spartans side moved to the Argoed Sports Ground and entered the league as Mynydd Isa Spartans. This sparked a period of large growth with a clear pathway for the club's youth section to play senior football for their local village. In his first season at the club, Hollyoak's Spartans finished runners up in the North East Wales League (Tier 5) and achieved promotion to the Welsh National League (Tier 4). Following a reorganisation on the Welsh football pyramid, the club joined the newly established North East Wales Football League in 2020.

The summer of 2023 saw the introduction of our new club logo that is proudly worn by all of our participants and volunteers as part of the official amalgamation of our adult and youth teams. The Spartans nickname was dropped and, for the first time, all teams would play under the same club name and structure as Mynydd Isa FC.

Since 2020, our senior section have won eight trophies between our First, Reserve and Development teams, with six of those trophies being won in the last two seasons alone in a golden period of success for the club. In 2023, Liam Evans succeeded the long standing Hollyoak as First Team Manager and led our First Team to the NEWFL Mike Beech Trophy after defeating FC Queens Park 5-1 in the final. The team also finished runners up in the NEWFA Horace Wynne Cup and achieved a best league finish since reforming. It was also an incredibly successful season for our Reserves, who won a league and cup double under the leadership of Chris Evans.

The success of the 2023/24 season was repeated in a historic 2024/25 season. Our First Team became league champions and achieved promotion to the Ardal Leagues (Tier 3). A few weeks later, they completed an unprecedented league and cup double with a 3-1 win against Rhostyllen in the NEWFL Premier Cup final. Our Reserves also became back to back league champions, but narrowly missed out on another double.

CHAIRMAN'S WELCOME

It was another closely fought contest and the team came away victorious thanks to two goals from Nathan Mendoza - much to the delight of the travelling fans!

There has been a lot of change in the summer with these teams as we look to provide a pathway for our younger players. After a narrow loss in their opening game, Evo's lads bounced back with a stoppage time victory over Saltney thanks to young Riley Williamson's late finish! Our U21s have been competitive against some Tier 1 and 2 academy sides and can hold their heads high. It is pleasing to see our younger lads develop and we really believe in this approach as a club.

At our recent AGM, our vice-chair Matty Williams stepped down from his role at the club. I'd like to thank Matty for his hard work and effort over the last few years and for being instrumental in modernising the club. Kris Farren was elected as our new vice-chair and Sarah Murray as our disciplinary officer. I would like to welcome Kris and Sarah to their roles and look forward to working with them as we continue to

push the club forward. I'd also like to thank everyone at the club for their hard work over the last year, in particular our coaches, volunteers, parents and players.

With both players and fans back from their holidays, we're hopeful of a strong performance on the pitch and our continued support off it! Enjoy the afternoon. Up the Isa!

TODAY'S VISITORS

BETHESDA ATHLETIC

Originally founded in 1946, the village of Bethesda had been represented in the footballing circle as long ago as 1919 in the first North Wales Coast league. The team went under the name of Bethesda Comrades - a popular name with many for a year or two after the First World War and belatedly they were called Bethesda United.

By the 1930's the club had adopted the name of Bethesda Victoria and was among one of the leading clubs on the North Wales circuit winning the North Wales Combination cup and North Wales Coast FA Challenge cup in the 1931/32 season.

Opting to remain in local competitions from the late 1970's, Bethesda rebuilt and rose to relative prominence again in the 1980's after the formation of the Gwynedd League. The 1984/85 season saw the club win both the Eryri Shield and Alves Cup, they reached the final of the North Wales Challenge Cup and had memorable run in the Welsh Cup which culminated in defeat at the hands of Shrewsbury Town.

In 1990 when following football clubs joined the newly formed Cymru Alliance, Bethesda decided to remain in the Welsh Alliance League. At the end on the 1990/91 season, Bethesda finished third in the league but the club opted to remain within the semi-professional arena and dropped down into the Caernarfon and District League.

In recent times, the club have won the North Wales Coast West League in 2022/23 and secured promotion to the Ardal North West. They were subsequently relegated in 2023/24 but bounced straight back as champions once again in 2024/25 and returned to the Ardal North West at the first attempt.

- In the event of a match being postponed or abandoned, any refund

 management. This is subject to a time limitation, the details of which
 are obtainable from the Club Committee. Persons entering the

 rearranged fixture.

- Standing in seated areas or in front of seated areas, whilst play is in progress, is strictly forbidden.







- Any person found damaging or defacing club property will be prosecuted.
- Persons failing to comply with the instructions from a Steward,
 Police Officer, or other authorised agent of the Club will be ejected from the Ground.
