OUR HISTORY

Mynydd Isa Football Club have represented the local community of the village since establishing in 1984. In recent years, the club has grown tremendously to become one of the largest in North Wales with over 500 participants from juniors to seniors.

The club's senior sides dissolved in 2009 leaving the village without a senior section. In 2016, James Hollyoak re-established the senior section as his Ewloe Spartans side moved to the Argoed Sports Ground and entered the league as Mynydd Isa Spartans. This sparked a period of large growth with a clear pathway for the club's youth section to play senior football for their local village. In his first season at the club, Hollyoak's Spartans finished runners up in the North East Wales League (Tier 5) and achieved promotion to the Welsh National League (Tier 4). Following a reorganisation on the Welsh football pyramid, the club joined the newly established North East Wales Football League in 2020.

The summer of 2023 saw the introduction of our new club logo that is proudly worn by all of our participants and volunteers as part of the official amalgamation of our adult and youth teams. The Spartans nickname was dropped and, for the first time, all teams would play under the same club name and structure as Mynydd Isa FC.

Since 2020, our senior section have won eight trophies between our First, Reserve and Development teams, with six of those trophies being won in the last two seasons alone in a golden period of success for the club. In 2023, Liam Evans succeeded the long standing Hollyoak as First Team Manager and led our First Team to the NEWFL Mike Beech Trophy after defeating FC Queens Park 5-1 in the final. The team also finished runners up in the NEWFA Horace Wynne Cup and achieved a best league finish since reforming. It was also an incredibly successful season for our Reserves, who won a league and cup double under the leadership of Chris Evans.

The success of the 2023/24 season was repeated in a historic 2024/25 season. Our First Team became league champions and achieved promotion to the Ardal Leagues (Tier 3). A few weeks later, they completed an unprecedented league and cup double with a 3-1 win against Rhostyllen in the NEWFL Premier Cup final. Our Reserves also became back to back league champions, but narrowly missed out on another double.

LLAY WELFARE

Founded in 1931, Llay Miners Welfare FC has proudly represented the village of Llay and its surrounding communities for over nine decades. Rooted in the rich history of Welsh mining culture, the club has grown from humble beginnings to become a key pillar of local football in Wrexham County Borough. The club's strong ties to the local community and its commitment to fostering young talent have been central to its ethos since its inception.

Llay Miners Welfare FC was originally established to provide recreational activities for the local mining community, with football quickly becoming the centrepiece. The club played in regional leagues, gaining a reputation for its hardworking spirit and resilience on the field, values that reflect the village's mining heritage.

Over the decades, Llay Miners Welfare FC steadily progressed through the Welsh football system, earning promotions and league titles including the Welsh National League (Wrexham Area) Division One in 1966/67, Premier Division in 1967/68, 1975/76 and 1981/82 and, more recently, Division Two in 2015/16. The Welly have also been runners-up in the Welsh Amateur Trophy in 1969/70 and NEWFA Challenge Cup winners in 2016/17.

A monumental chapter in the club's history was written in 2024, when the club achieved promotion to the Cymru North beating Llanuwchllyn in the Ardal Northern Play-Off Final. After punching above its weight for much of its debut season at Tier 2, the Welly were relegated back to the Ardal North West in 2025.

- Standing in seated areas or in front of seated areas, whilst play is in progress, is strictly forbidden.




