OUR HISTORY

Mynydd Isa Football Club have represented the local community of the village since establishing in 1984. In recent years, the club has grown tremendously to become one of the largest in North Wales with over 500 participants from juniors to seniors.

The club's senior sides dissolved in 2009 leaving the village without a senior section. In 2016, James Hollyoak re-established the senior section as his Ewloe Spartans side moved to the Argoed Sports Ground and entered the league as Mynydd Isa Spartans. This sparked a period of large growth with a clear pathway for the club's youth section to play senior football for their local village. In his first season at the club, Hollyoak's Spartans finished runners up in the North East Wales League (Tier 5) and achieved promotion to the Welsh National League (Tier 4). Following a reorganisation on the Welsh football pyramid, the club joined the newly established North East Wales Football League in 2020.

The summer of 2023 saw the introduction of our new club logo that is proudly worn by all of our participants and volunteers as part of the official amalgamation of our adult and youth teams. The Spartans nicknamed was dropped and, for the first time, all teams would play under the same club name and structure as Mynydd Isa FC.

Since 2020, our senior section have won eight trophies between our First, Reserve and Development teams, with six of those trophies being won in the last two seasons alone in a golden period of success for the club. In 2023, Liam Evans succeeded the long standing Hollyoak as First Team Manager and led our First Team to the NEWFL Mike Beech Trophy after defeating FC Queens Park 5-1 in the final. The team also finished runners up in the NEWFA Horace Wynne Cup and achieved a best league finish since reforming. It was also an incredibly successful season for our Reserves, who won a league and cup double under the leadership of Chris Evans.

The success of the 2023/24 season was repeated in a historic 2024/25 season. Our First Team became league champions and achieved promotion to the Ardal Leagues (Tier 3). A few weeks later, they completed an unprecedented league and cup double with a 3-1 win against Rhostyllen in the NEWFL Premier Cup final. Our Reserves also became back to back league champions, but narrowly missed out on another double.

WELCOME

Welcome to the Argoed Sports Ground for this evening's Lock Stock Ardal North West match against St Asaph City and to our first ever club programme! I'd like to extend a warm welcome to the match officials and all of the St Asaph players, coaching team, committee and supporters in attendance today. I'd also like to wish all a safe journey home following the conclusion of the match.



This evening's match is our first ever home league match in Tier 3 since the old senior team's demise. This game has been a long time coming with a lot of hard work behind the scenes over the last few years to ensure the ground criteria met the FAW's Tier 3 standards. That counts for nothing if the team don't do the business on the pitch and the players and coaches have certainly done their bit and achieved a historic league and cup double to secure promotion to this level. Liam and his coaching team have done an amazing job over the last few years and I have no doubt they will look forward to the challenge of leading the club into the third tier. They have earned the opportunity to compete against some of the biggest clubs in North Wales and should be extremely proud of what they have achieved so far!

Season tickets are now available to purchase with details of how to do so in this programme. I'm delighted to say match sponsorships have sold out in no time! Thank you to anyone who has supported the club and volunteered their time to help with the organisation of the games. We really appreciate it!

Finally, I'd like to congratulate all involved on a historic year last season and wish everyone the best of luck for this season!

TODAY'S VISITORS

ST ASAPH CITY

The first documented mention of football in St Asaph appears in a book called "Companion to Asaph" published in 1888. According to the author a club called St Asaph Football Club that had been in existence for some time became St Asaph Athletic Football Club in 1885. In 1887 the team reached the final of the North Wales Junior Cup. At that time the team played at Elwy Park Grove, the present venue of St Asaph Football Club.

The most recent incarnation of the club reformed for the 1990-91 season after ten years without a Senior football team. The team had Graham Hunter and Simon Nixon as joint player managers. They were accepted back into the Premier League and had a very successful season finishing runners up in the league, winning both the President's Cup and the League Cup and runners up in the Auxilliary League. In season 1991-92 the first team finished fourth in the Clwyd Premier League and won both the Presidents Cup and the League Cup.

In the 1992-93 season the first team became Clwyd League champions and were promoted to the Welsh Alliance. The team finished mid table and were looking forward to consolidating their position during the next season. Their hopes however were dashed when an arson attack destroyed the changing rooms and without the required facilities the team had to fold.

Football returned to St Asaph in 2000 when the junior football teams were formed to play in the Rhyl and District Junior League. The Council built a new Pavilion which was opened in 2006 and Senior football was re-established in 2006-07 season when the team joined the Clwyd League Division 2.. After finishing second in 2008-09 the team were promoted to Division 1. The following season 2009-10 the team won the League Championship and were promoted to the Premier League. Season 2012-13 saw the team become champions of the Premier League and win promotion to the Welsh Alliance League Division 2 finishing fourth in the League and sharing the Fair Play Trophy with Blaenau Amateurs.

Season 2014-15 saw the Saints crowned Champions of Division 2 as well as completing the double by winning the League Cup. From season 2015-16 to season 2019-20 they played in the Welsh Alliance Division 1, winning the Fair Play Trophy in season 2016-17.

Most recently, St Asaph were relegated from the newly formed Lock Stock Ardal North West in 2021/22 and only to bounce straight back up in style with a treble in 2022/23. A 6th place finish the following season was a league high in this division for the Saints.



 rearranged fixture.

- Standing in seated areas or in front of seated areas, whilst play is in progress, is strictly forbidden.





 Police Officer, or other authorised agent of the Club will be ejected from the Ground.
